Brief Program Description:

Political science is the study of government, public policy, and the political behavior of individuals and groups. Students in the Bachelor of Arts in Political Science program with an emphasis in International Affairs graduate with an understanding of the relationships among and between societies in countries around the world. This concentration combines coursework from international relations and comparative politics, along with the basics of political science. Students can take courses on a variety of topics, including domestic governing institutions; conflict and political violence; international cooperation, law, and organizations; foreign policy; regional politics; and social science ideas and methods.
