- IV. Describe the proposed changes to the program as well as the rationale for making the specific changes and include any relevant supporting data.
 - The Human Services curriculum (HUSV) underwent revisions to comply with the <u>CSHSE</u> accreditation report and this alignment provided an opportunity to offer skills-based courses that students take for the HUSV minor. Previously, students were taking courses that did not emphasize human services practice. This new configuration provides students with the opportunity to learn foundational skills required of practitioners. Most of the students who minor in HUSV are in the social or behavioral sciences such as Human Development and Family Studies, Psychology, or Sociology. These changes provide students with an opportunity to understand the practitioner lens that works well with a solid social or behavioral science foundation. In addition, the proposed minor configuration provides a stronger foundation for students to enter into the human services professions directly from their undergraduate degree while also preparing them with practical skill-based knowledge if they elect to pursue a terminal graduate degree in counseling, marriage and family therapy, or social work.
