Expandthe existing curriculum as an emphasis in Performance & Directing, and create a new emphasis in Design & Production. These proposed changes will provide directed pathways within the existing Live and Screened Performance degree. Students will share a common core to develop an understanding of how to make and produce live theatrical performance, then will have the option to specialize in either Performance & Directing or Design & Production.

Enrollment in our design courses continues, though we disestablished the BFA in Theatre Production two years ago. Prospective students also reach out inquiring about our design and production coursework and program. The new emphases will give students with an interest in these courses a pathway to a degree and make the existing degree more competitive with programs at other universities.
