In recognition of the student's achievements, students awarded a posthumous degree or certificate of achievement will be included in the next Commencement program.	Posthumous Degree, Posthumous Certificate of Achievement, and Compassionate Certificate of Achievement The University of Arizona extends compassion and understanding to students whose academic progress is permanently halted due to significant medical events. This policy outlines the criteria and procedure for requesting a certificate of achievement or posthumous degree when a student passes away or when an extraordinary circumstance, such as terminal illness, prevents them from completing their academic program.
