IV. Describe proposed changes to the major. Provide a rationale and explanation for making changes to the major and include any relevant supporting data. The purpose of this modification is to establish the BA in Music as a degree plan that reflects the goals of a liberal arts program as defined by the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM), the accrediting agency of the Fred Fox School of Music. Once the sub-plans have been disestablished (done through separate memos), what is left in our degree is a narrow core (defined by NASM as "musicianship") that does not reflect the range of musicianship competencies that NASM expects for liberal arts students in music. The existing core is mostly focused on Western classical music history and theory and does not emphasize the various paths that students may pursue to fulfill musicianship goals as outlined by NASM. The new "Core Electives" category addresses this need.

In this modification, to ensure that basic music competencies are reached, students will be required to take one semester of music theory and one semester of class piano. This plan also maintains the existing 3-unit performance requirement, but with an expanded list of course choices that better reflects the varied levels and interests of students pursuing a liberal arts degree.

Our recent accreditation review from NASM indicated that our BA in Music was not meeting its goals in that the content of the sub-plans did not reflect the names of the official emphases that students were pursuing. This signaled to us that our BA was too heavily prescribed in nature; our change to the requirements of the major goes hand-in-hand with our separate disestablishment of the sub-plans, which — in keeping with the traditional goals of a liberal arts degree and those of our accreditation agency — is meant to allow individual students more flexibility in determining a unique pathway through the major that responds to their needs and to growing areas of inquiry in the field. A more flexible degree core, one that takes into account the various ways that musicianship is understood in the 21st century, is needed in order to point students in appropriate ways toward the major electives that best suit their needs. Changing the units in the major from 54 to 48 units better aligns our BA in Music with the curricular proportions suggested by NASM for liberal arts degrees in music. Also, in this new plan, students may still pursue the same paths of study as they would have using the previous sub-plans, but now with more flexibility; all courses previously listed in our sub-plans as electives will continue to be listed in the modified degree as additional electives.

Total units required for each emphasis must be equal.

This institution's degree is structured similarly to our modified degree in the following ways:

- Students must complete certain specifically required foundational courses in the field
- Students select other core courses from a broader list
- Students select from a list of performance-related experiences
- Students choose from a range of electives.

The differences between the degrees are as follows:

• University of Wisconsin divides its core (aside from its required courses) into categories from which students must choose a certain number of credits each; in our core, students select from the complete range of courses listed

This institution's degree is also structured similarly to our modified degree in the following ways:

- Students must complete certain specific foundational courses in the field
- Students are required to complete a certain number of upper-division courses
- Students select from a range of electives

The differences between the degrees are as follows:

- Brown University does not require performance experiences; our degree does
- Brown University requires one of its upper division electives to be in a specific area (musicology or ethnomusicology); our degree will lack this specific restriction
- Brown University has no core beyond the required foundational courses; our degree will have an elective-based core beyond those courses
- Brown University requires a capstone project; our degree will not have this requirement
