Rationale for Request (~100 words)

The Mel and Enid Zuckerman College of Public Health (MEZCOPH) started an undergraduate program in 2010. The major in Public Health is designed to allow students to gain a broad range of knowledge regarding the field of public health, to obtain a concentrated area of knowledge in one or two specific areas and to obtain field experience for future employment. At the outset, MEZCOPH was approved a \$30/unit differential tuition for public health majors. The program has significantly increased in popularity and we currently have 1066 active Majors and Pre-Majors. Revenue generated from the differential tuition will allow MEZCOPH to keep pace with increasing costs so we can continue to provide better oversight and feedback to the students regarding their required internships and portfolios that all students in the program are required to complete and to have community-based faculty members be engaged with teaching courses.

Compliance with Board Guidelines (~250 words)

(1) The differential tuition will substantially increase the quality of the learning experience for the student, providing a basis for opportunities that justify the extra cost to the student. The differential tuition allows MEZCOPH to enhance an applied curriculum and provide the student support services necessary to have a continual communication with community organizations. The fees will also decrease the need for MEZCOPH to limit the enrollment in its courses and will be used in part to support course instruction.

(2) The differential tuition will provide set aside for need based aid at a rate of 14% and this will be monitored on an annual basis for compliance.

(3) As a professional school, MEZCOPH's operational costs are greater than normal academic programs for the following two reasons: required field experiences, and its mission to provide outreach to Arizonans. Field based courses are part of the curriculum for all undergraduate students. Every student is required to complete an intensive internship course that involves oversight by an academic advisor. Students interact directly with public and private agencies providing community based public health services and research.

Student Consultation (~100 words)

We consulted with students via one survey and two discussion groups. A total of 25 undergraduates completed the survey. Each student was asked "What do you consider to be a reasonable increase in differential tuition so we can continue to support teaching assistants and have advisors and faculty who can support your courses, internships and research?" Most students (83.3%) stated \$20 per credit as the amount to increase. Only four responses stated greater than \$20 per credit. The mean value of an increase was \$22.92. We also received 20 individual comments. Most comments cited that an increase would not be welcome and they thought tuition was already too much. However, several comments mentioned that it would be worthwhile to increase the differential tuition to support advising and instructors.

MARKET PRICING (~200)

There is a strong market for the undergraduate Public Health Program as it grew by 19.6% from 2014 to 2015. The UA was in the middle of the total cost for resident tuition compared with with 11 undergraduate programs

that are located in state funded accredited schools of public health. Nonetheless, with the continual rise in student numbers the market indicates that the students will be able to absorb the new differential tuition fee.
